#### **PREFACE**

This book is intended to capture the records and highlights of the US Open and U.S.

Championships during the 133 years of the event. It deals solely with the highest level of national and/or international competition held under the auspices of the United States Tennis Association since 1881. Thus, this media guide contains the records of the five principal championships: men's and women's singles, men's and women's doubles, and mixed doubles.

For the purposes of these records, the following events are considered to be the highest level of competition:

All events of the so-called "National Patriotic" tournaments of 1917;

All events staged in conjunction with the women's singles tournaments at the Philadelphia Cricket Club from 1887 on;

All events in the five competitions held as part of the US Open Tennis Championships program since 1968, but not other events held during those years.

A word of caution concerns some of the early records, particularly those in women's competition. These records are compiled from the best available sources, but some material was discarded since its accuracy was in doubt.

The US Open Media Guide and Record Book was created in 1979, when the USTA enlisted New York Sports Historian Bill Shannon to compile a history of the U.S. Championships. The USTA also acknowledges the efforts of the late Frank V. Phelps for his assistance in historical research.
