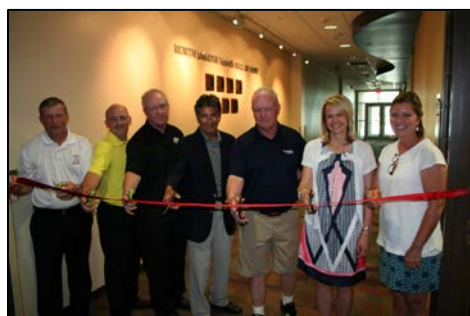

The seven distinguished members making up the Class of 2014 included long-time coach and community tennis leader **Robert “Bob” Cordova** (Bismarck, N.D.), tennis playing legend **Larry Dodge** (Fargo, N.D.), tennis advocate **Warner McNair** (Fargo, N.D.), tournament player and high school coach **Sandy Wald-Clooten** (Bismarck, N.D.), standout competitor **Phil Woledge** (Fargo, N.D.) and coaching legends **Tim Wynne** (Grand Forks, N.D.) and **Tom Wynne** (Grand Forks, N.D.).

Terry Jordre and Bob Fishback Inducted Into SD Hall of Fame

Aberdeen’s **Terry Jordre** and **Bob Fishback** (right) of Brookings were inducted into the 2014 SD Tennis Hall of Fame Sunday, July 27, at the McKennan Park tennis complex in Sioux Falls during the Asfora/Clayton SD Adult Open tennis tournament. Jordre was a top prep basketball and tennis player out of Corona, S.D., and won every conference singles and doubles tennis title at Northern State in Aberdeen. In basketball, he was a key player for the Wolves team that made four appearances in national tournaments. Fishback is well known for his commitment to playing and supporting tennis throughout S.D., but particularly in Brookings. Still actively competing at age 78, Fishback’s leadership and contributions in Brookings led to the construction of the Hillcrest Courts tennis complex during the 1970’s. The 2014 SD Tennis Achievement Award goes to two long-time high school tennis coaches who together served their schools for over 50 years; **Gayle Klein** of Mitchell High School and **Tim Mulhair** of Yankton High.





Wyatt McCoy, Jessie Aney Win 2014 US Open Northern Sectional Qualifying Tournament

Wyatt McCoy (Shoreview, Minn.) and **Jessie Aney** (Rochester, Minn.) won the men's and women's singles titles, respectively, at the 2014 US Open Northern Qualifying Championships at Baseline Tennis Center June 19-22 on the University of Minnesota campus. McCoy and Aney both advanced to the US Open National Qualifying Championships in New Haven, Conn., in late-August. The winner of that tournament then receives a wild card into the 2014 US Open. McCoy, who is going to be a senior at Notre Dame, had an easy time in winning his first title, defeating 18-year-old Jesse

Ruder-Hook (Denver, Colo.) 6-2, 6-0. The 16-year-old Aney, who will play tennis at the University of North Carolina in the fall of 2015, defeated good friend **Alexis Nelson** (St. Paul, Minn.) 6-3, 7-5 in the final. This will be Aney's second trip to New Haven as she and partner **Eric Frueh** (Rochester, Minn.) played in the 2012 mixed doubles tournament there. In mixed doubles, the team of Heather Nobler and Zach Northey (both of Lincoln, Neb.) will represent USTA Northern after defeating Ross Greenstein (San Diego, Calif.) and Mira Ruder-Hook (Denver, Colo.) 6-3, 6-2 in the finals.

Tony Larson, Alexis Nelson Win Aquatennial Singles; Niltooli Wilkins Wins Two Events

Veteran **Tony Larson** (Fridley, Minn.) and newcomer **Alexis Nelson** (St. Paul, Minn.) took home the singles titles at the 2014 Canadian Pacific Aquatennial Tennis Classic presented by Lipton Tea & Honey July 14-25 at Canadian Pacific Plaza in downtown Minneapolis and the Baseline Tennis Center. Larson won his third-straight Aquatennial title and sixth crown in the last seven years beating **Raoul Schwark** (Edina, Minn.) 6-0, 7-5. The 15-year-old and top-seeded Nelson (right) defeated #2 seed **Sonya Das** (Arden Hills, Minn.) 6-4, 6-3 to win her first Aquatennial title. **Katie Wessman** (Minneapolis, Minn.) and **Niltooli Wilkins** (Burnsville, Minn.) won the women's doubles crown with a 6-4, 5-7, 1-0 (7) win over the Gustavus duo of **Laurel Krebsbach** (North Oaks, Minn.) and **Michaela Schulz** (Elk River, Minn.). Wilkins also claimed the mixed doubles title with her brother **Nazhone** (Burnsville, Minn.) 6-1, 6-3 over **John Pratt** (Minneapolis, Minn.) and **Tasha Pintusava** (Minneapolis, Minn.). In men's doubles, former Gophers **Julian Dehn** (Minneapolis, Minn.) and **Reven Stephens** (St. Louis Park, Minn.) won their first title with a 6-2, 6-2 win over **Mikey Kantar** (Minneapolis, Minn.) and **Hamish Weerasinghe** (Edina, Minn.).

InnerCity Tennis Receives \$10,000 Coca-Cola Grant

InnerCity Tennis in Minneapolis was one of 10 NJTL programs nationwide to receive a \$10,000 grant from the USTA Foundation and the Coca-Cola Foundation. The USTA Foundation, the national charitable organization of USTA, received a grant in the amount of \$125,000 from the Coca-Cola Foundation, the philanthropic arm for The Coca-Cola Company (NYSE: KO), and as part of the grant, the USTA Foundation funded \$10,000 to 10 National Junior Tennis and Learning (NJTL) programs nationwide that utilize the ACE (Academic Creative Engagement™) Curriculum. The ACE curriculum provides hands-on academic lessons in literacy and math and includes additional lessons on nutrition, all designed to encourage academic achievement, health and wellness while developing social skills.

St. Paul Urban Tennis Receives USTA Serves Grant

Congratulations to **St. Paul Urban Tennis** in St. Paul, Minn., who received a grant from USTA Serves, the national charitable foundation of the USTA. Four Juniors Receive USTA Serves College Scholarships

Congratulations to **Andrea Erdman** (Mankato, Minn.), **Thu Nguyen** (St. Anthony, Minn.), **Alexandra Howard** (St. Louis Park, Minn.) and **Whitney Erickson** (Spring Valley, Minn.) who all received college scholarships from USTA Serves, the

national charitable foundation of the USTA. Overall, USTA Serves awarded 49 high school students a variety of college scholarships totaling \$330,000. Erdman and Nguyen were two of 30 people receiving the \$8,000 USTA Serves College Education Scholarship given to high school seniors who have excelled academically, demonstrated community service and participated in an organized tennis program. Howard won the \$2,500 Eve Kraft Education & College Scholarship, which is bestowed upon two high school seniors, one male and one female, who have excelled academically, meaningfully served their communities, played tennis in an organized program and who reside in an economically disadvantaged community. Erickson was honored with the \$1,000 College Textbook Scholarship that provides a one-time award to assist students in purchasing textbooks or supplies.
